

### Question 1: (65 points)

- (a) What is the name of the software, board, and programming language that we have used in the lab experiments? (4 points)
- (b) What are the necessary files to run a project on the board? What are their extensions? (3 points)
- (c) What are the necessary files to run a project in simulation environment? What are their extensions? (3 points)
- (d) Write the code that would appear after you create the following figure on software. (5 points)



(e) Write the following equation in the form of the programming language we used in the lab. Please pay attention to the syntax. You do not need to worry about the header and port definitions. (10 points)


X = AB+C+BAC Y = CBAB+AAB

X,Y,A,B,C are variable names

- (f) Make the truth table of X and Y. (5 points)
- (g) Implement (e) option in the simulation. **Make sure** to show the simulation screens working in the class to get a grade for this option. (35 points)

## Question 2: (25 points)

- (a) What is the decoder? Explain in short by showing the truth table of 3 to 8 decoder. (3 points)
- (b) Draw the 3 to 8 decoder showing all inputs and outputs as a following box. You do not need to draw full schematic of decoder for this question. (3 points)



- (c) Write the equation for each output (D0, D1, ... D7) of the 3 to 8 decoder in terms of inputs. (4 points)
- (d) Draw the full schematic of 3 to 8 decoder using any logic gate(s) you need. (5 points)
- (e) Please implement and draw the following function using 3 to 8 decoder: f(a,b,c) = (a'+b)(b'+c)(a+c) (10 points)

### Question 3: (10 + 40 points)

(a) In experiment 8, we implemented a 7-segment display (numbers on the board from 0-9). We have used the following code for that implementation. Please explain the reason behind this code. What does this code really do? (10 points)

a <=NOT((not I(2) and not I(0)) or (I(1)) or (I(2) and I(0)) or (I(3)));
b<= NOT((not I(2)) or (not I(1) and not I(0)) or (I(1) and I(0)));
c <= NOT((not I(1)) or I(0) or I(2));
d <=NOT((not I(2) and not (I(0))) or (not I(2) and I(1)) or (I(2) and not I(1) and I(0)) or (I(1) and not I(0)) or (I(3)));
e <= NOT((not I(2) and not (I(0))) or (I(1) and not (I(0))));
f <= NOT((not I(1) and not (I(0))) or (I(2) and not (I(1))) or (I(2) and not (I(0)));
g <=NOT((not I(2) and (I(1))) or (I(2) and not (I(1))) or (I(2) and not (I(0)));</pre>
```

### **Extra Part:**

(b) Please implement 7-segment display code on the board such a way that board should display 2 when it is supposed to show 0. If you cannot implement in this way, you can implement a regular 7-segment display that we did in the experiment 8. Please notice that you will lose 20 points if you go with the second option. (40 points)
